## Elval in the highest ranks of the Business IT Excellence (BITE) Awards 2014

Elval was awarded a top distinction for its participation in the Business IT Excellence (BITE) Awards 2014, on June 30<sup>th</sup>. Its winning entry had the title: "Advanced Supply Chain Planning and Optimisation for Elval (Aluminum Rolling Industry)".

The category ELVAL participated in, concerns organizations that have recently implemented projects or initiatives in the fields of IT (Information Technology) and communications, applications, infrastructures and services as well as best management practices that support the company's business strategy. ELVAL got one of the four highest rankings so it got a top distinction.

Evaluation criteria included project innovation, significance for the sector, benefits for the company and its customers, alignment with corporate strategy, project methodology, implementation and utilization approach.
